In the Factory Act banned children under 9 from working in the textile industry, and the working hours of year olds was limited to 48 hours a week, while year olds were limited to 69 hours a week, and 12 hours a day. The hours of adult men still remained unregulated. With the industrial revolution work ceased to be seasonal and limited by daylight hours, as it had in the past.

This often makes it difficult for workers to limit their working hours. Cruelty and torture was enacted on children by master-manufacturers to maintain high output or to keep them awake. With the industrial revolution work ceased to be seasonal and limited by daylight hours, as it had in the past. However, factories and mills undermined the old style of authority.

This was a common trend, because mothers would work 14 to 16 hours a day, leaving the Factory Act made women and young adults work hour days and children from the ages 9 to 13 were to work 9 hour days.
