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Eventually, Aristotelian physics became enormously popular for many centuries. Physical explanations in the sublunary realm revolved around tendencies. The statistical versus absolute interpretations of the second law of thermodynamics set up a dispute that would last for several decades producing arguments such as "Maxwell's demon" and that would not be held to be definitively resolved until the behavior of atoms was firmly established in the early 20th century. These shortcomings of classical physics were never to be resolved and new ideas, the easiest and simplest of these was the observation of the ideal gas law in the thermal appearances.
